## **PRIVATE GYPSY CARAVAN SITE OPPOSITE VILLAGE HALL, HORTON ROAD**

The village hall was full on the first day of the **public inquiry** on 16 December and the purpose – to let the Planning Inspector know the extent of local opinion – was certainly achieved. Unfortunately the proceedings were not able to be wrapped up on the two days allocated and a further 3 days have been set aside for consideration of further proofs of evidence on flooding and contamination.

(These times are prescribed by the Planning Inspectorate which unfortunately means that those who have to work are not able to attend)

The proceedings will take the same format and once again the public will be allowed to speak at the discretion of the Inspector on the day. The Parish Council wishes to submit evidence of flooding on the land and will produce photos from the centenary history book but would welcome the loan of other items of evidence. If anyone has photos of the polystyrene infill of the late 1960s/early 70s, these would be invaluable.

If you intend to go to Sevenoaks on these days please try and arrange car sharing as there may be people who would like to attend who do not drive. The Parish Council did think about having the inquiry in the village hall again but considered the substantial disruption to the Pre-School and other regular users outweighed the now much lesser need for the public to attend in large numbers.

## STATION ROAD PARKING

The proposals have been agreed for implementation and the Traffic Order has been passed to Kent Highways for signature.

Advertisements indicating this will be in the local papers shortly if they have not already appeared by the time this newsletter is circulated..

The Order will be in place but will not be in operation until the signs/lines are installed. The precise timing of the introduction of the lines and signage is weather dependent as well as needing cooperation between Sevenoaks and Dartford councils to ensure the lines in the respective boroughs are done at the same time. However at present it is hoped that they will be in place by the end of March..

## CCTV

PC Andy Blackmore, West Kent Police's Crime Prevention Officer, gave information and answered questions on CCTV equipment at the last Parish Council meeting. The moveable camera that the Police have installed temporarily in Horton Road, which has been very useful in connection with 2 recent incidents, costs £6,000. PC Blackmore said that a percentage of crime is displaced to other areas when cameras are installed but it has also been shown that a percentage of crime is actually reduced.

He said that if the Parish Council bought a similar camera, the Police could monitor it. The camera is controlled via a laptop so is flexible in its use and is easily moved to a different hotspot when needed.

The Parish Council agreed to consider further at the next meeting on 26 January whether money should be allocated in the 2009/2010 budget for cameras in the parish.

The Parish Council would also welcome comments from Parishioners on whether they support the installation of cameras. Please address comments to the Parish Clerk at the Village Hall office by 25th February.

## **PORTABLE APPLIANCE TESTING Saturday 7 March**

**It is now a requirement that all portable appliances used in the village hall have an up to date PAT test.**

This means that even the smallest electrical devices such as phone chargers brought in by regular or casual users have to comply. The Parish Council has arranged for all appliances to be tested on Saturday 7 March at a cost of £1.50 per item. Come along with your items to the village hall between 10 am and 12 noon.

## **STREET LIGHTING**

The Parish Council is considering upgrading some or all of its street lighting units if it is possible to then hand them over to KCC to maintain. Some of the lights are very old and newer ones should be much more efficient to run. Whatever happens the Parish Council asks that all landowners help by cutting their trees back if they are obscuring the lights in order to maximise their efficiency.

### **Door to Door callers from Energy Suppliers**

Kent Trading Standards strongly advise consumers to be very careful when dealing with traders at their door. Make sure you understand what is being signed and that you are happy with any details provided before signing. Make sure that you are not being misled into signing a contract. There have been reports of salesmen asking for signatures against information supplied which could unknowingly result in a contract being signed.

The new **Cancellation of Contracts Made in a Consumer's Home or Place of Work etc. Regulations 2008** replace previous regulations and extend the existing law on cooling-off periods and cancellation rights for consumers. They cover contracts that are made during both solicited and unsolicited visits by traders.

The regulations apply to all contracts with a total payment of more than £35 and they will set the cooling off period to a minimum of seven calendar days. Cancellation rights also need to be clearly and prominently displayed in any written contract or provided in writing if there is no written contract.

If you are considering changing your energy supplier it is always best to compare tariffs and charges before signing a contract. To find a reputable supplier ask for recommendations from friends and family.

## **SOUTH DARENTH & HORTON KIRBY ACTION GROUP**

The Action Group was formed in 1988 to protect the community against the proposals for a Channel Tunnel rail link through the villages.

The Action Group remains in existence with a watching brief but it has now been decided to wind up the Group. Members of the original Committee have met to discuss arrangements for this and disposal of its funds amounting to approximately £11,316.

Specific proposals for the use of this money, including costings, are invited and should be sent to the Action Group c/o the Horton Kirby and South Darenth Parish Council Office at the Village Hall. Closing date is 31 March 2009 and the Committee will meet again then to make a final decision. It is hoped the money can provide a lasting legacy which will benefit the community.

The Parish Council receives regular warnings from a number of sources including the police and trading standards and where possible places the warning on the village hall noticeboard outside the Parish Council office.

One recent message said that since the beginning of the year the number of scam emails circulating and scam telephone calls seem to have reached an all time high. One telephone scam is worth mentioning, the caller gives a staff number (which is false), and promises a card rebate after raising questions about the misuse of your credit card in a way that could lead you to believe the call is genuine, it then concludes by asking for your card number and card 3 digit security number. **NO CREDIT CARD COMPANY OR BANK WOULD DO THIS. THIS A SCAM**
