## **NEW PARISH COUNCILLOR ROGER HOUSE**

Roger has been a resident in Horton Kirby since 1986. He is married to Lynda and has two children. He is a past member of our local Lions Club and Rotary and now concentrates much of his efforts in representing and supporting the small business community as Regional Chairman of The Federation of Small Businesses (FSB). ## **SPEEDING AND PARKING**

This subject which affects most of us in South Darent and Horton Kirby was discussed at our recent parish meeting with local Police officers who say they are advising people about their speed and tackling parking on pavements when they see it or when reported. A request for speed bumps in East Hill was also discussed and the Police and the County Councillor agreed to investigate. At the meeting parish councillor Dawn Mitchell said: “The public needs to be aware that the Police have no powers to give tickets for parking on our double yellow lines; Sevenoaks District Council officers carry out this function and details of offending vehicles should be reported to them every time they are seen.” She added: “Every incident of speeding should be reported to the Police so that they are aware of the scale of the problem we have here.”
